Subjects

You will select 5 - 6 subjects from this list: English, Media Studies, Art History, ESOL (English as a second language), Physical Education, Outdoor Education, Languages, Mathematics with Statistics or Calculus, Biology, Marine Studies, Chemistry, Physics, Horticulture, Economics, Business Studies, Geography, History, Drama, Music, Photography, Design, Painting, Digital Technology, Food Technology, Home Economics, Hospitality, Graphics & Design, Mechanical Engineering, Product Development, Tourism, Early Childhood Studies, Textiles and Maori Performing Arts.

Languages

Students wanting to study French, Spanish, Japanese or German can join the Video Learning Network.

NCEA

International Students can collect credits towards the National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA). German students can gain University Entrance valid for German universities if they take a specific approved combination of subjects.

Maori Culture

About half of our students identify themselves as Maori. Maori Culture is an important aspect of our school. The Maori language and culture are taught. New Internationals students are welcomed in a Maori ceremony (powhiri), have the opportunity to see Kapa Haka (Maori Performing Arts) and participate in other Maori cultural activities.

Uniform

We have an attractive black and white uniform, worn by all students from year 9 - 13. We supply each of our International Students with a double set of new uniform items.

Homestay

You will stay with one of our homestay families. Our Homestay Coordinator takes great care in matching students with suitable families. Often life long friendships are made.

- Support Services

Our Director of International Students Sue Whale and our Homestay Coordinator Wendy Dunlop will look after you while you are here. The form teachers, Heads of House, Guidance Councillor and other staff are also available to help you with any concern that may arise. We have a nurse at school. A physiotherapist and a doctor visit once a week.

- Code of Practice

We are a signatory to the Ministry of Education's Code of Practice for International Students. This means that we adhere to a high standard of service at school and at home.
